### Jubilee FAQ



- 1. Do you still need volunteers to assist with the Jubilee? YES, WE DO!**

- 2. Can a pack, troop, or crew camp out the full weekend or come Saturday morning?** Yes, all units can camp the full weekend – Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. A unit also has the option to come Saturday morning and camp Saturday to Sunday. Please let Matt Hensinger know if you are arriving Saturday by emailing him at [matthew.hensinger@yahoo.com](mailto:matthew.hensinger@yahoo.com).
- 3. What food is available at the Jubilee?** The Jubilee will only be providing food for Cub Scouts and their parents on Saturday for a fee of \$5. This lunch will include a hot dog, chips, dessert, and a drink. You will need to secure a ticket at check-in for your lunch. The Schuylkill County Fair Grounds will have a concession stand open during the day on Saturday as part of the tractor pull. You are welcome to buy food from this concession stand, but HMC Jubilee Committee has no control over this food.
- 4. Can we bring unit trailer to the Jubilee?** Yes, you can bring your trailer. There will be special parking for the trailer and the vehicle towing the trailer. You will need to unload your gear and move the trailer as quickly as possible. Trailers will not be allowed to remain in the campsite the duration of the Jubilee.
- 5. What is our masking policy?** You are required to wear a mask inside all enclosed buildings on the fairgrounds October 1-3, 2021.
- 6. Will we need to have a Covid-19 Screening form to attend?** Yes, everyone attending the Jubilee will need to complete this form before coming to the event or you will need to complete when you register. You can download this form here – <https://hmc-bsa.org/golden-jubilee/>
- 7. How large is our campsite?** Camp sites will be 70' x 30' and adjusted up or down depending on how many Scouts and leaders will be camping at the Jubilee.
- 8. Why are you promoting leave no trace camping during the Jubilee?** We are asking units to bring less equipment and gear since there is limited space. We are also asking units to leave the fairgrounds better than we found them. Please make sure you pack out your trash.
- 9. Should I bring a camping/bag chair to the Jubilee?** Yes, you should bring a camping/bag chair to the Jubilee especially if you are attending the closing campfire.

- 10. When will we get our registration materials and patches?** You will receive them when the unit officially registers at the Fair Grounds. Registration for units camping Friday open at 4:30 PM. Please do not come any sooner! Saturday registration will open at 8 AM. Registration is located at the main gate entrance.
- 11. What is the Jubilee Tenting Policy?** It is up to the unit to determine if non-family members will camp 1 or 2 per tent. This is a charter partner/unit committee decision. Please follow all Youth Protection Guidelines related to tenting.
- 12. Can a pack and troop from the same charter partner camp alongside each other?** Yes. Please let Matt Hensinger know if you want to camp together by emailing him at [matthew.hensinger@yahoo.com](mailto:matthew.hensinger@yahoo.com).
- 13. Will there be parking at the fairgrounds?** Yes, there will be plenty of parking at the fairgrounds. Please follow the directions on the map for parking.
- 14. How will we get our gear to the campsite?** Unit will be allowed to take their trailer or vehicle with their gear to the campsite, unload and move quickly. It is important we keep open the roads through the fairgrounds. We will not allow individual vehicles to transport gear to the campsite. Please consolidate all gear to one or two vehicles.
- 15. Will there be any events at HMSR?** No. In our original Jubilee plans we were going to utilize HMSR for some activities and bus Scouts, leaders, and parents to the camp. The Jubilee Committee has determined we can accommodate our full program at the fairgrounds.
