Come join other Scouts from the Black Rock District at the No.9 Mine!

Cost per person is \$20 per person and includes lunch, guided mine tour, various activities, and patch.

All units must follow the Youth Protection policies of the BSA – 2 leaders per Troop and all adults staying overnight need to be registered with the BSA and have current Youth Protection Training. If you are not sending a Troop contingent, individual Scouts will be paired with a Troop attending provisional style like summer camp.

Activities offered at this year's Camporee are:

- Tour of the No.9 mine, the longest continuously operated deep Anthracite coal mine in the world (1855 June 22, 1972). Please note that the mine is 50 degrees year-round a light jacket or sweater is recommended, as well as sturdy closed-toe shoes as the paths in the mine are loose gravel and muddy in some areas.
- Tour of the No.9 mine museum
- Guided hike to the mine shaft head frame (top of mine elevator shaft)
- HAM radio demonstration
- Tomahawk throwing
- Coal shoveling competition
- Coal sack races
- Service project hours (it is a Black Rock tradition to do a bit of service for the Camporee location A Scout if Helpful!)
- Coal shaker demonstration see how different sized pieces of coal got sorted
- Merit badges:
 - Radio prerequisites 1A-D, 2D, 8
 - Mining in Society prerequisites 1A-C, 7 (pick one)
- Cast Iron Chef Competition
 - Theme is, appropriately, COAL REGION!
 - All items must be cooked in cast iron skillet, Dutch oven, etc.
 - 3 courses appetizer, entree, and dessert
 - Must be enough for our judges to sample every dish. There will be 3-4 judges.
- More activities likely if you have a special skill or station you would like showcase or run, please let us know!

As with all Scouting events, all participants must have a BSA medical form (parts A, B1, and B2) with them. The easiest way is to keep them with your onsite leader.

Please note that there is limited parking at the Mine, we may ask participants to move to the alternate parking area after unloading – signs will be displayed during the event.

The mine and museum will also be open to the public during their normal hours, please do not interfere with the normal operation of the mine.

There are railway tracks that run throughout the property, please stay off and away from them for safety.
